December 31, 2010 and 2009

NOTE A - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization

ZERO - The Project to End Prostate Cancer (ZERO) was, formerly known as the National Prostate Cancer Coalition Fund (NPCCF). NPCCF was formerly known as the National Prostate Cancer Coalition, Inc. (NPCCI). NPCCI was originally incorporated under the laws of the state of Florida on September 6, 1996, and NPCCF was incorporated under the laws of the District of Columbia on July 7, 1998. On December 21, 1998, NPCCF merged with NPCCI. On May 8, 2008, the Board of Directors voted to change the organization's name to ZERO - The Project to End Prostate Cancer. ZERO's primary activities include increasing public awareness of prostate cancer and serving as an advocate for action, advances and change regarding the disease.

The Board of Directors voted in December 2005 to establish the Drive Against Prostate Cancer, LLC (the LLC) as a wholly owned subsidiary of ZERO. The LLC was formally established on January 23, 2006 pursuant to the Delaware Limited Liability Act and is intended as a organizational instrument to facilitate the work of the drive against prostate cancer.

In April 2006, the LLC received donated contributions of two RV vehicles valued at approximately \$395,000. For the years ended December 31, 2010 and 2009, the LLC received in-kind contributions of approximately \$92,000 and \$97,000, respectively, for qualified drivers, maintenance, fuel, storage and other operational costs of the vehicles in conducting the screening program. On July 14, 2010, the LLC was dissolved and a Certificate of Cancellation was issued. The assets of the LLC were absorbed by ZERO. All activities of the LLC through July 14, 2010 are included in the books of ZERO. The LLC is considered a disregarded entity for tax purposes and all activity is included in ZERO's filings.

Tax Status

ZERO is exempt from federal and state income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code (the Code). ZERO is, however, subject to income taxes on any unrelated business income. In addition, the Internal Revenue Service has determined that ZERO is not a private foundation within the meaning of Section 509(a) of the Code.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

Cash equivalents consist of funds invested in interest and non-interest bearing checking and operating accounts.

NOTE A - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Contributions Receivable

Contributions are recognized when the donor makes an unconditional promise to give. Management expects all contributions receivable to be fully collectible; accordingly, no allowance for doubtful accounts is required. It is management's policy to charge off uncollectible receivables when management determines the receivable will not be collected.

Inventory

Inventory consists of ZERO t-shirts, hats, water bottles and pins and is stated at cost.

Property and Equipment

ZERO capitalizes all property and equipment acquisitions of \$1,000 and above. Property and equipment are carried at cost if purchased or fair value at date of donation, if contributed. Depreciation is computed using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives of the assets. Expenditures for maintenance and repairs are charged to expense as incurred.

Contributions

ZERO reports gifts of cash and other assets as temporarily restricted if they are received with donor stipulations that limit the use of the donated assets. Restricted contributions for which the restrictions are met in the year received are considered unrestricted for financial statement purposes. When a donor restriction expires, that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished, temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Sources of Revenue

Contributions and grants are received from individuals, corporations and foundations.

Donated Services and Supplies

Donated services are recognized as contributions. If the services (a) create or enhance nonfinancial assets or (b) require specialized skills, are performed by people with those skills, and would otherwise be purchased by ZERO.

Functional Allocation of Expenses

The costs of providing the various program and other activities have been summarized on a functional basis in the statement of activities. Accordingly, certain costs have been allocated among the programs and supporting services benefited.

NOTE A - ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (Continued)

Allocation of Joint Costs

In 2010, ZERO incurred joint costs of approximately \$360,000 for program events activities that included fundraising appeals. Of those costs, approximately \$324,000 was allocated to program expense, \$18,000 was allocated to fundraising expense and \$18,000 was allocated to management and general.

Reclassifications

Certain 2009 amounts have been reclassified for comparative purposes.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

Accounting for Uncertain Tax Positions

Financial Accounting Standards Board (FASB) Accounting Standards Codification 740, Income Taxes (ASC 740) requires that a tax position be recognized or derecognized based on a "more-likely-than-not" threshold. This applies to positions taken or expected to be taken in a tax return. ZERO does not believe its financial statements include, or reflect, any uncertain tax positions.

Program Description

ZERO's name speaks to its mission. Zero PSA. Zero prostate cancer cases. Zero prostate cancer deaths. Zero tolerance for prostate cancer. All of which leads to ZERO's goal: Generation ZERO, the first generation of men free from prostate cancer. ZERO provides comprehensive treatment information to patients and education to those at-risk through ZERO's website (www.zerocancer.org) and free electronic newsletter Aware. The Drive Against Prostate Cancer mobile medical testing program provides free prostate cancer testing across the U.S. while the Dash for Dad/Great Prostate Cancer Challenge race series, Prostate Cancer Awareness Month, the DEPEND Campaign to End Prostate Cancer, Know Your Score: Fight Prostate Cancer and the Summit to End Prostate Cancer raises awareness and engages communities in the quest to achieve Generation ZERO.

NOTE B - MAJOR CONTRIBUTORS (Continued)

One member of the Board of Directors contributed a total of \$100,000 to ZERO during 2010 and 2009

At December 31, 2010, approximately \$240,000 or 94% of contributions receivable was due from one contributor. At December 31, 2009, approximately \$150,000 or 89% of contributions receivable was due from one contributor.

NOTE C - CONTRIBUTIONS RECEIVABLE

ZERO has recorded contributions receivable at the present value of estimated future cash flows as of December 31, 2010 and 2009. Contributions receivable due in more than one year are discounted at a rate of approximately 2%.

NOTE E - CONCENTRATIONS OF CREDIT RISK

ZERO maintains its cash at financial institutions in the Washington DC metropolitan area. The accounts at this institution are insured by the Federal Deposit Insurance Corporation (FDIC). At times, deposits exceed federally insured limits. Management, however, does not consider this a significant credit risk.

NOTE F - OPERATING LEASES

In 2009, the Organization moved into donated office space for the first six months of 2009. The Organization then rented on a month to month basis until a new lease was signed on August 4, 2009. The new lease commenced on August 5, 2009 and expires August 4, 2019. The lease includes an annual escalation clause as defined in the lease agreement.

During 2007, the Organization entered into an operating lease agreement for office equipment. The lease term was for three years and expired August 13, 2010.

On September 1, 2009, the Organization entered into an operating lease agreement for additional office equipment. The lease term is for three years and expires August 31, 2012.

NOTE G - RETIREMENT PLAN

In 2005, ZERO adopted a section 403(b) Retirement Plan (the Plan). All regular full-time and part-time employees who work seventeen-and-one-half (17.5) hours or more weekly are eligible to participate in the Plan through salary deferrals.

Participation in the Plan begins on the first day of the month following ninety (90) days after the date of hire. ZERO does not contribute to the Plan.
