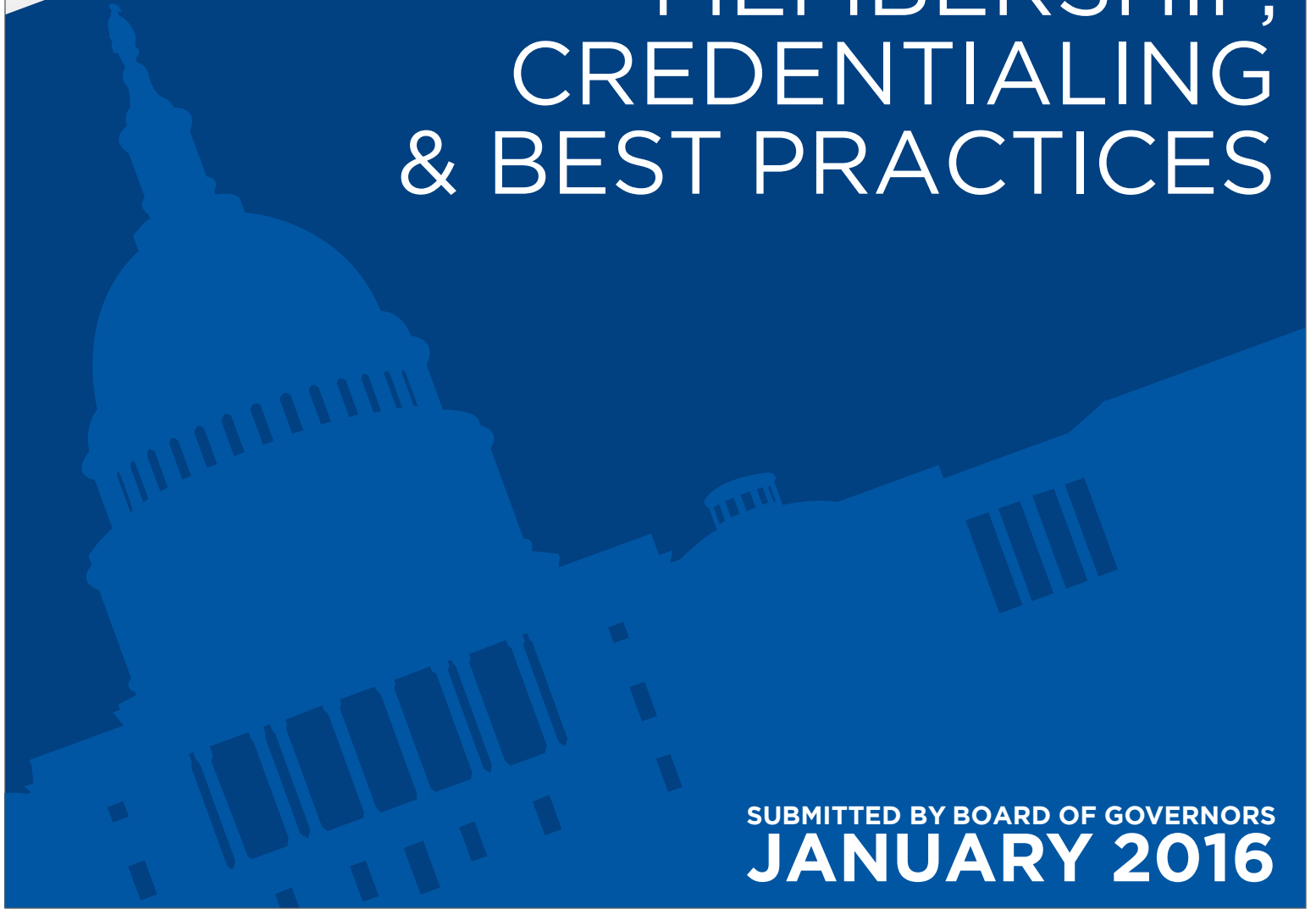

NANO ensures nonprofit CEOs build a team that takes them where they want to go.

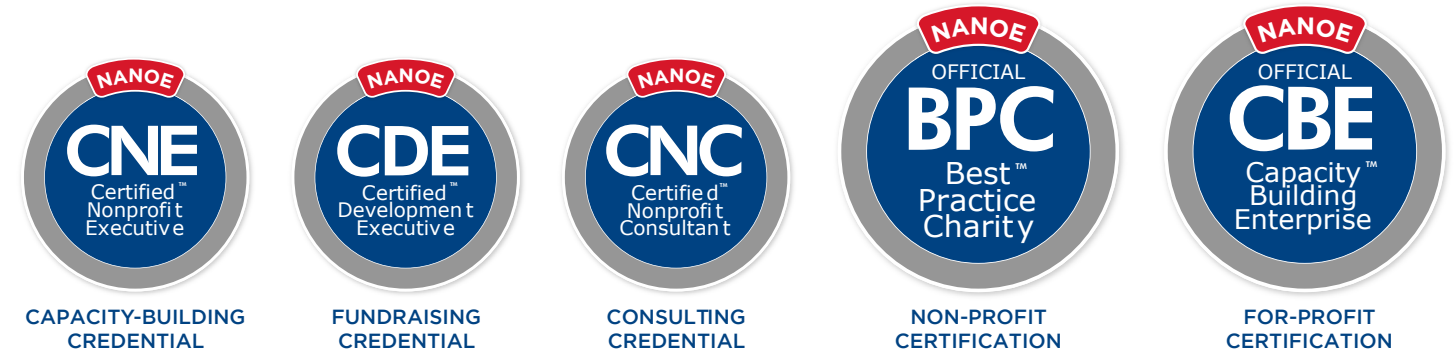

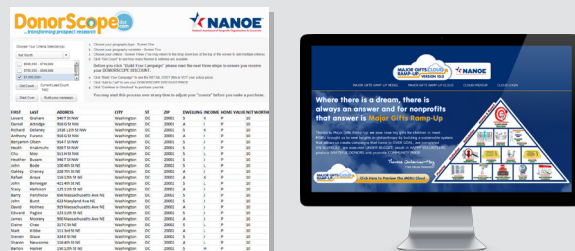

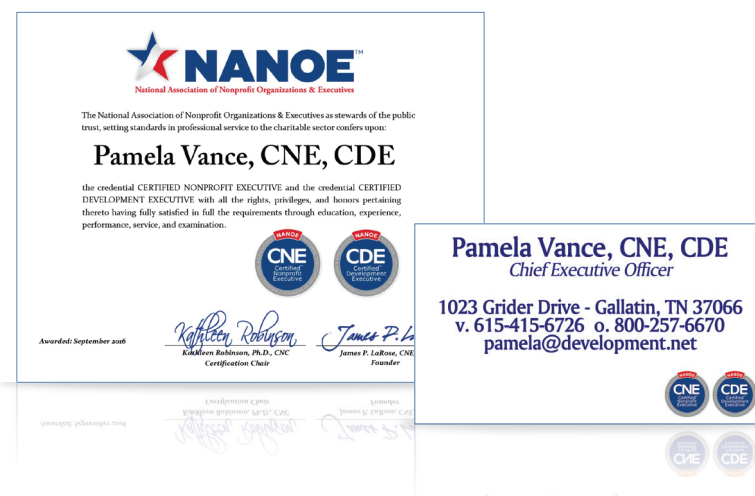

Practitioners who hold CNE learn new ways to prioritize capacity-building that ensures they weather the tumultuous seasons of nonprofit administration. ## CERTIFIED DEVELOPMENT EXECUTIVE (CDE)

Many fundraisers come to the nonprofit sector with great intentions to advance a charity's mission without having correctly answered the question, "who is our customer?" Executives mistakenly think that the rain forest, the student, the homeless or a family-in-need are their customers and therein lies the difficulty. Individuals you serve are not your customers because they have no money. # BEST PRACTICES

## NEW GUIDELINES THAT CHANGE EVERYTHING

RELEASE DATE - MAY 2016

**N**ANOE has established a national Board of Governors comprised of leading practitioners, scholars, funders, policy makers and advocates to oversee the creation of a new set of universal governing best practices for charity. This project has been undertaken so that pressing social and environmental problems are able to be solved at significant enough scale to eradicate major issues. NANOE Governors have endorsed the following plan to achieve this goal:

- Thorough exploration and critical review of relevant capacity-building theory and existing research.
- Wide-ranging consultation with practitioners to expand an understanding of how capacity-building initiatives put into practice actually work.
- Performance of new university led surveys within the public, private and nonprofit sectors
- A commitment to an inclusive, open, participatory process for input and feedback from groups of practitioners, scholars, funders and advocates in the field.

## AREAS RECOGNIZED BY NANOE GOVERNOR'S AS HAVING AN EFFECT ON CAPACITY BUILDING:

### 1 **MOTIVE**

Identifying factors explaining nonprofit leader's intention to build capacity

### 2 **MONEY**

Acknowledging the sector's failure to prioritize income generation

### 3 **MOVEMENT**

Discovering patterns within the sector that promote enterprise growth

### 4 **MANAGEMENT**

Replacing both executive directors and volunteer boards with strong CEOs

### 5 **MEDIUMS**

Setting new workplace standards for salaries, benefits, retirement, etc.

### 6 **MEANS**

Exploring financial eco-systems within private, public and nonprofit sectors

### 7 **METHOD**

Exploring the ways Associations, Consultants & Academia influence leaders

### 8 **MODELS**

Codifying new systems that exponentially grow charitable enterprise
