Dear Sir or Madam:

This letter is in response to your request for a copy of your organization's determination letter will take the place of the copy you requested.

Our records indicate that a determination letter issued in December 1969 granted your organization exemption from federal income tax under section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code. That letter is still in effect.

Based on information subsequently submitted, we classified your organization as one that a private foundation within the meaning of section 509(a) of the Code because it is an organization ascribed in sections 509(a) (1) and 170(b)(1)(A)(vi).

This classification was based on the assumption that your organization's operations would notinue as stated in the application. If your organization's sources of support, or its character, method of operations, or purposes have changed, please let us know so we can consider the effect of the change of the exempt status and foundation status of your organization.

Your organization is required to file Form 990, Return of Organization Exempt from IncomeTax, only if its gross receipts each year are normally more than \$25,000. If a return is required, it must belied by the 15th day of the fifth month after the end of the organization's annual accounting period. The laximposes a penalty of \$20 a day, up to a maximum of \$10,000, when a return is filed late, unless thereis reasonable cause for the delay.

All exempt organizations (unless specifically excluded) are liable for taxes under the Federal Insurance Contributions Act (social security taxes) on remuneration of \$100 or more paid to each emplyee during a calendar year. Your organization is not liable for the tax imposed under the Federal Unemplyment Tax Act (FUTA).

Organizations that are not private foundations are not subject to the excise taxes under Clapter 42 of the Code. However, these organizations are not automatically exempt from other federal excit taxes.

Donors may deduct contributions to your organization as provided in section 170 of the Cote. Bequests, legacies, devises, transfers, or gifts to your organization or for its use are deductible for fetral estate and gift tax purposes if they meet the applicable provisions of sections 2055, 2106, and 2522 of the Code.

Your organization is not required to file federal income tax returns unless it is subject to thetax on unrelated business income under section 511 of the Code. If your organization is subject to this tax it must file an income tax return on the Form 990-T, Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Return. In this letter, we are not determining whether any of your organization's present or proposed activities are wirelated trade or business as defined in section 513 of the Code.

The law requires you to make your organization's annual return available for public inspection without charge for three years after the due date of the return. If your organization had a copy of its application for recognition of exemption on July 15, 1987, it is also required to make available for public inspection a copy of the exemption application, any supporting documents and the exemption letter to any individual who requests such documents in person or in writing. You can charge only a reasonable fee for reproduction and actual postage costs for the copied materials. The law does not require you to provide copies of public inspection documents that are widely available, such as by posting them on the Internet (World WideWeb). You may be liable for a penalty of \$20 a day for each day you do not make these documents available for public inspection (up to a maximum of \$10,000 in the case of an annual return).

Because this letter could help resolve any questions about your organization's exempt status and foundation status, you should keep it with the organization's permanent records.
