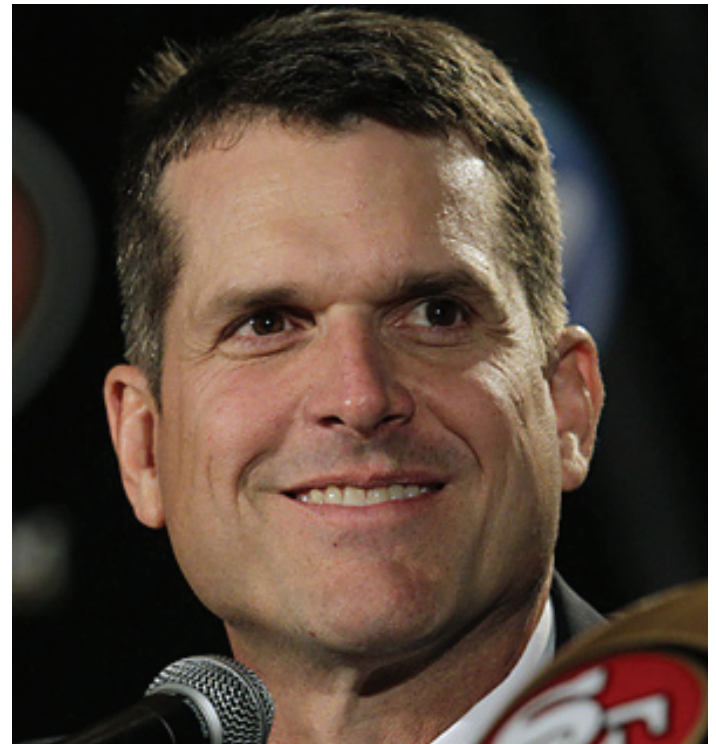

## Stanford Honors JobTrain Heroes

Sometimes you just have to stop and realize that who you are and what you do make you very special. On February 29, JobTrain Medical Office Assistant Instructor Joy Martin-Spriggs and her student, Lacole Phillips, were honored as “local heroes” during a Stanford women’s basketball game. This is Stanford Athletics’ way of recognizing the best Bay Area organizations and their people for making a positive difference in their communities.

When Joy and Lacole walked out on the court at Maples Pavilion, they were greeted with wild applause. It was an experience both women said they will cherish forever. Among the thousands of fans in Maples Pavilion were approximately 60 JobTrain students, staff and board members who attended the special occasion compliments of Coach Tara VanDerveer.

In her six years as a JobTrain instructor, Joy has helped many hundreds of students recognize their potential and launch solid careers. Joy’s effective teaching style is credited with her Medical Office Assistant class having the highest attendance rates at JobTrain. Moreover, her graduates enter the job market armed with marketable vocational skills and a renewed sense of purpose and self-confidence.

Lacole credits Joy with helping her believe in herself – something she struggled to do before enrolling in the MOA

class. Despite battling a restrictive language disorder, Lacole maintains a positive “can-do” mindset. Lacole compensates for her challenge with diligence, dedication to her studies and precise focus and determination. In recognition of her stellar performance and attitude in the Medical Office Assistant program, Lacole received JobTrain’s Trainee of the Month Award in February. Lacole intends to continue with her formal education after she graduates from JobTrain in May.



## Wells Fargo Selects Project Build for Small Business Renovation Project

Imagine reality shows like HGTV’s “Design on a Dime” and Bravo’s “Top Design,” then imagine construction workers from JobTrain doing the actual work. Partnering with the Wells Fargo Small Business Renovation Program and Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center, Project Build students from JobTrain are providing critically needed makeovers for (3) small businesses located in San Mateo County low income neighborhoods.

The project began on March 12, 2012 as part of a small business improvement campaign launched by Wells Fargo. Each business owner provided (10) hours of sweat equity towards the project. Anis Hair Studio, Taqueria Los Temos and Vega’s Market & Grill each received \$3,000 worth of cosmetic

improvements to enhance their businesses. However, this special undertaking “is really about transforming and empowering communities,” said Greg Young, Community Development Officer at Wells Fargo. As part of the award, these local merchants also receive customized training in small business development and learn how to access capital through workshops offered by Renaissance Entrepreneurship Center.

Beginning in June, these three businesses will receive free ATM advertising on all Wells Fargo ATMs in San Mateo County. In the meantime, please be sure to check out the great work done by JobTrain’s Project Build students and show your support at these local businesses!

## JobTrain “LIKES” Facebook

JobTrain delegations of students and staff expressed their appreciation for their new neighbor, Facebook, at a series of Menlo Park and East Palo Alto City Council meetings recently. Facebook, the world’s largest and most popular social media company, is now headquartered only minutes away from JobTrain. Facebook will generate employment opportunities for thousands of local residents in years to come, and JobTrain “likes” that potential opportunity for their graduates. During the council’s open forum sessions, Facebook was praised by many local educators, environmentalists and community organizations.

For JobTrain student David Ibarra, Facebook’s presence “is the best thing that has ever happened to my neighborhood.” David is a 28 year old single father, studying solar photovoltaic installation at JobTrain. David delivered his first-ever public speech to the Menlo Park City Council. “I am confident Facebook will be a BIG plus for our community by providing employment opportunities and helping to serve as role models for youth and people at JobTrain,” he said. In response to concerns about the added traffic caused by Facebook’s expansion, David asked, “Wouldn’t you

agree that it’s better to have traffic because people actually have jobs – rather than traffic from hundreds of people desperately driving around trying to find employment?”

## JobTrain Partners with PG&E and Community Colleges To Prepare Young People for Careers in Energy Industry

JobTrain is participating with PG&E, San Jose City College and College of San Mateo in a National collaborative pilot program created to help young people between the ages of 16 and 26 explore career opportunities in the energy industry. The program, called “Get Into Energy”, was launched by the Center for Energy Workforce Development.

Edward Mora is a testament to the program’s success. Edward is enrolled in “Get Into Energy” at College of San Mateo and works closely with JobTrain’s

Career Development Specialist Nancy Peccorini. Mora had high scores on the PG&E assessments, is thriving in his course work, and hopes to launch a career with PG&E.

This summer, JobTrain will operate an innovative and exciting new program: Energy Industry Fundamentals. The five-week course provides a broad understanding of the electrical and natural gas utility industry, including basics of energy generation, transmission and distribution.

## Menlo Park Mayor Makes Time to Read to JobTrain Preschoolers

Despite the demands of leading city council meetings, working as a lawyer, vying for a seat on the San Mateo County Board of Supervisors and raising two children, Menlo Park Mayor Kirsten Keith made time to visit JobTrain’s preschool. She brought a big donation of toys with her.

## CalTrans and San Mateo County Work with JobTrain to help Former Inmates

Perhaps the only thing more frightening than being behind bars is the fear that your past will still imprison you after you are released. For many former inmates, failure to find work can feel like a life sentence. Ex-offenders face tough challenges getting hired.

A new program that features employment preparation and work experience with pay is being offered to people being released from jail in San Mateo County. This program is a three-way partnership among San Mateo County (Achieve 180), CalTrans and JobTrain. Recently released men and women will participate in paid work experience positions

maintaining state roadways in a 90-day transitional employment program. In addition to wages, participants will gain new skills and an invaluable chance to establish a recent work history.

JobTrain will operate the program on behalf of the county and CalTrans and will oversee 144 workers over two years. Participants can be assured that JobTrain will be with them every step of the way to ensure their success. JobTrain has long believed that the best social service program in the world is a job – including being a strategy to reduce recidivism.

## Teri Eyre Joins Board

Teri Eyre of Hewlett-Packard is JobTrain's newest board member. Teri's interest in JobTrain began in 2010 when JobTrain hosted "Community Day" for HP's Global HR World Summit.
