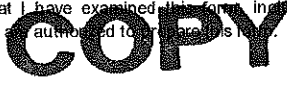

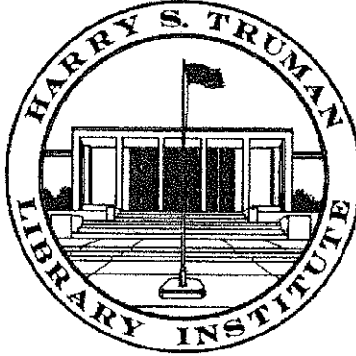

**ARTICLE I
NAME, SEAL AND OFFICES**

Section 1. Name

This Corporation shall be known as

THE HARRY S. TRUMAN LIBRARY INSTITUTE
FOR NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS

Section 2. Seal

The seal of the Corporation shall be circular in form, not more than two inches in diameter, and shall bear the inscription on its outer edge, THE HARRY S. TRUMAN LIBRARY INSTITUTE FOR NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS, and in the center, CORPORATE SEAL 1957.

Section 3. Offices

(a) The principal office of the Corporation shall be at the Harry S. Truman Library in Independence, Jackson County, State of Missouri. The Corporation may have such corporate offices anywhere within and without the State of Missouri as the Board of Directors from time to time may appoint.

(b) The registered office and the registered agent of the Corporation in the State of Missouri shall be determined from time to time by the Board of Directors. The address of the registered office and the name of the registered agent shall be on file in the office of the Secretary of State of Missouri pursuant to applicable provisions of law. Unless otherwise permitted by law, the address of the registered office of the Corporation and the address of the business office of the registered agent shall be identical. Unless otherwise permitted by law, if the registered agent is an individual he or she shall be a Missouri resident.

ARTICLE II BOARD OF DIRECTORS

Section 1. Number

The affairs of the Corporation shall be managed by a Board of Directors consisting of up to thirty (30) persons, each of whom shall be elected as provided in Article II, Section 5(a), or appointed to fill a vacancy as provided in Article II, Section 13 (sometimes referred to as "**Regularly Elected Directors**"). In addition, there shall be one ex officio Director ("**Ex Officio Director**") who shall be the person then serving as the Director of the Harry S. Truman Library. (Regularly Elected Directors and the Ex Officio Director are sometimes collectively referred to as Directors or as the Board of Directors.)

Section 2. Qualification

To achieve a balance of expertise on the Board of Directors, the Board of Directors shall use reasonable efforts to comply with the following guidelines in selecting Regularly Elected Directors: leaders in education and culture; representatives from a variety of regions and institutions; and individuals of diverse ethnic backgrounds; each of whom can be expected to be useful to the Corporation and its programs; people with the ability to actively participate in the resource development activities of the Corporation; members of Truman-related organizations with which the Corporation would like to maintain a close affiliation; and former recipients of Harry S. Truman Scholarships who have the capacity to provide expertise or resources to the Board of Directors and committees thereof. At all times, a minimum of two Regularly Elected Directors must be scholars with academic expertise in Truman-related issues.

Section 3. Powers

All the corporate powers granted to the Corporation by the State of Missouri are hereby vested in and shall be exercised by the Board of Directors.

Section 4. Coordination of Programs

The Director of the Truman Library (the "**Library Director**"), as the Ex Officio Director, shall be responsible for the coordination of programs supported by the Corporation that relate directly to the ongoing functions of the Harry S. Truman Library. As the Truman Library Institute's Coordinator of Programs, the Library Director (or his or her designee), in consultation with the Officers of the Corporation, shall have authority over and supervise staff persons paid with the Corporation's funds who are involved in the development and delivery of programs.

Section 5. Elections - Terms

(a) Regularly Elected Directors shall be elected at the annual meeting ("**Annual Meeting**") of the Board of Directors, or at any special meeting ("**Special Meeting**") or regular meeting ("**Regular Meeting**") (Annual Meetings, Special Meetings, Regular Meetings and Mandatory Special Meetings, as defined in Section 8 of this Article II hereof, sometimes herein referred to as 'meetings') thereof, when appropriate, by a majority of the votes cast by the Directors, voting in person, except that the Executive Committee, as provided in Section 13 of this Article, may determine that such a vote be accomplished by use of a mail ballot, if then permitted by law. The Ex Officio Director shall not be elected but shall serve a term commencing with and ending with his or her service as Library Director, and the provisions of this Section 5 relating to the number of years in a term and the number of consecutive terms a Regular Director may serve shall not apply to the person serving as Ex Officio Director. Cumulative voting for Regularly Elected Directors shall not be allowed. Regularly Elected Directors shall be elected to serve for three-year terms, and a Regular Director shall be limited to serving three consecutive terms. No service as a Regular Director prior to the 1997 Annual Meeting of Directors shall affect future service as a Regular Director with respect to term limits.

(b) Should the number of Regularly Elected Directors be increased, such increase shall be deemed to create vacancies for which first terms shall be filled in such a manner so as to maintain an equivalent number of Regularly Elected Directors' terms expiring each year (or as equal as possible depending on the total number of Directors.) Regularly Elected Directors elected under this provision to a one- or two-year term will be eligible to serve three consecutive additional three-year terms thereafter. Regularly Elected Directors elected under the provisions of this article to a term of three years will be eligible to serve two consecutive additional three-year terms thereafter.

(c) Regularly Elected Directors elected at the 1997 Annual Meeting of Directors to serve one or two-year terms will be eligible to serve three consecutive additional three-year terms thereafter. Regularly Elected Directors elected at the 1997 Annual Meeting of the Directors to serve a three-year term will be eligible to serve two consecutive additional three-year terms thereafter.

Section 6. Annual Meeting

The Annual Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held each year at the Harry S. Truman Library in Independence, Missouri, or at a location designated by the Executive Committee, at a date and time fixed by the Executive Committee with the Executive Committee using reasonable efforts to accommodate the schedules of all Directors, with notice thereof given no later than ten (10) days before the date of the Annual Meeting. Such Annual Meetings shall be for the purpose of electing Regularly Elected Directors and Officers and for the transaction of such other business as may properly come before the meetings.

Section 7. Regular Meetings

In addition to the Annual Meeting, at least one (1) Regular Meeting of the Board of Directors shall be held each year at the Harry S. Truman Library in Independence, Missouri, or at a location designated by the Executive Committee at a date and time fixed by the Executive Committee with the Executive Committee using reasonable efforts to accommodate the schedules of all Directors. Additional Regular Meetings of the Board of Directors may be held at such time and place as the Board of Directors or Executive Committee may designate by resolution from time to time.

Section 8. Special Meetings

Special Meetings of the Board of Directors may be called by the Chairperson of the Board or the President, or in the absence or disability of the Chairperson of the Board, a Vice Chairperson, or by resolution of the Board of Directors duly adopted or by the written consent of a majority of the Directors. Special Meetings must be called when a written request therefore signed by not less than one third of the Directors is delivered to the Secretary ("**Mandatory Special Meetings**".) The date, place and time for Mandatory Special Meetings shall be as specified in the written request delivered to the Secretary. The date, time and place for Mandatory Special Meetings for which no date, time and place are specified in such written request of Directors shall be established by the Chairman of the Board, or upon the failure of the Chairman of the Board to act within ten (10) days of such written request of Directors, by the President. Such Mandatory Special Meetings shall be held no later than thirty (30) days following the expiration of the ten (10) period described above.

Section 9. Provisions Applicable to the Annual, Regular and Special Meetings

(a) Notice of the time, place and purpose or purposes of any meeting of the Board of Directors may be given by any Officer of the Corporation and shall be served personally or by mail, facsimile transmission, express delivery service or telegram not less than ten (10), nor more than sixty (60) days before the meeting, upon each Director. If mailed, such notice shall be directed to the Director at his or her address as it appears in the records of the Corporation unless the Director shall have filed with the Secretary of the Corporation a written request that notices intended for him or her be mailed to some other address, in which case it shall be mailed to the address designated in such request. If notice of a meeting is given to a Director by mail or express delivery service, it shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail or with the express delivery service, with postage or delivery charges thereon prepaid, respectively, addressed to the Director at his or her residence or usual place of business. If notice is given by facsimile transmission or telegram, it shall be deemed to be delivered when a successful facsimile transmission to a facsimile machine of the Director is confirmed by the sender's facsimile machine or when it is delivered to the telegraph company, addressed to the Director at his or her residence or usual place of business, respectively. Attendance of a Director at any such meeting shall constitute a waiver of notice of such meeting, except where a Director attends a meeting for the express purpose of objecting to the transaction

of any business because the meeting is not lawfully called or convened and states such objection immediately after the meeting is called to order. Notice of any meeting of the Board of Directors may be waived by any Director either prior to or subsequent to the meeting in question. Directors may participate in any meeting of the Board of Directors by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment whereby all persons participating in the meeting can simultaneously hear each other. Participation in a meeting in this manner shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

(b) At any time and from time to time during any meeting of the Directors, the presiding officer of the meeting, as provided in Section 10 of this Article, may declare the meeting to be in executive session ("**Executive Session**"), during which Executive Session, all persons who are not Regularly Elected Directors may be excused from the meeting. The Board of Directors is not permitted to adopt policy or resolutions or take other formal action during such Executive Session. The minutes of the meeting will reflect that the meeting went into Executive Session, but will not report the discussions during the Executive Session.

Section 10. Chair of Meetings

At all meetings, the Chairperson of the Board, or in the Chairperson of the Board's absence, a Vice Chairperson designated by the Chairperson, or in his or her absence a chairperson chosen by the Directors present, shall preside.

Section 11. Quorum - Adjourned Meetings

A quorum shall consist of not less than one-third of the Directors in office immediately before the meeting begins. In the absence of a quorum, or when a quorum is present, a meeting may be adjourned from time to time by a majority of the votes cast by the Directors present in person without notice other than by announcement at the meeting and without further notice to any absent member. At any adjourned meeting at which a quorum shall be present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally notified.

Section 12. Voting

At every meeting of the Directors, each Director present in person, including the Ex Officio Director, shall be entitled to vote. Each Director shall be entitled to one vote. Upon the demand of any Director, the vote upon any question before the meeting shall be by written ballot. All elections shall be had and all questions decided by a majority of the votes cast by the Directors present in person. An abstention shall be counted as a vote not cast.

Section 13. Vacancies

Whenever a vacancy occurs among the Regularly Elected Directors, through death, resignation, retirement, disqualification or other cause, the Secretary shall advise the chairperson of the Nominating Committee of the existence of the vacancy. The Board of Directors shall elect the person to fill any such vacancy. In the event that such vacancy occurs when, in the opinion of the Executive Committee, it is impractical or inconvenient to wait until the next Regular Meeting or Annual Meeting, or to call a Special Meeting, the Directors may be asked to vote by mail. In case of a vacancy occurring with respect to a Regular Director, the duration of whose term is fixed for a definite period by these Bylaws, the Regular Director chosen to fill such a vacancy shall serve for the unexpired portion of the term and until his or her successor shall have been elected and qualified. Service for the remainder of any unexpired portion of a term shall not affect a Regular Director's eligibility to serve as a Regular Director for three consecutive terms thereafter. If the number of Regularly Elected Directors be increased, such increase shall be deemed to create vacancies in the Board to be filled by the Board of Directors as herein provided in Article 2, Section 5.

Section 14. Compensation of Directors

Directors shall not receive any stated salary for their services, but may request, and if requested shall be entitled to receive, reimbursement for actual and reasonable expenses they incur to attend any meeting of the Board of Directors or meeting of a Committee on which they serve.

**ARTICLE III
OFFICERS**

Section 1. Number

The officers ("**Officers**") of the Corporation shall be a Chairperson of the Board, one or more Vice Chairpersons, a President, a Secretary, a Treasurer and such other officers with such powers and duties not inconsistent with these Bylaws as from time to time may be created and elected by the Board of Directors. Unless determined otherwise by the Board of Directors, no person shall hold more than one office at the same time.

Section 2. Election - Qualifications - Term - Vacancy

(a) The Officers of the Corporation shall be elected to serve two-year terms by the Board of Directors from among the Directors. Officers shall be elected at the Annual Meeting in years ending in odd numbers, by a majority of the votes cast by the Directors, voting in person, except that the Executive Committee, as provided in Section 2(b) of this Article, may determine that such a vote be accomplished by use of a mail ballot, if then permitted by law. No Officer shall serve more than two consecutive terms in the same office unless a specific exception is formally approved by the Board of Directors. No

service as an Officer prior to the 1997 Annual Meeting of the Directors shall affect future service as an Officer with respect to term limits.

(b) In case the office of any Officer of the Corporation becomes vacant by death, resignation, retirement, disqualification or any other cause, the Directors then in office, although less than a quorum, may elect a Director to fill such vacancy at a Regular Meeting, Special Meeting or Annual Meeting, and the Officer so elected shall serve the unexpired portion of the term of the Officer he or she is replacing and until the election and qualification of his or her successor. In the event that such vacancy occurs when, in the opinion of the Executive Committee, it is impractical or inconvenient to wait until the next Regular Meeting or Annual Meeting or to call a Special Meeting, the Directors may be asked to vote by mail. Service for the remainder of any unexpired portion of a term shall not affect an Officer's eligibility to serve as an Officer for two consecutive terms thereafter.

Section 3. The Honorary Chairpersons

There shall be one or more honorary chairpersons ("**Honorary Chairpersons**") of the Corporation. Margaret Truman Daniel and Clifton Truman Daniel shall serve as Honorary Co-Chairpersons of the Corporation. This shall in no way affect his or her eligibility to serve as a Regular Director, if also serving as a Regular Director. Honorary Co-Chairpersons will be eligible to attend, and vote at any meeting of the Board, and upon matters otherwise presented to the Board, and may vote at any meeting of any of the Corporation's standing or ad hoc committees (other than the Audit Committee.) Notwithstanding the grant of such voting rights, such Honorary Co-Chairpersons are not deemed members of the Board for other purposes, including in determining whether a quorum requirement has been met, or whether the requisite vote has been obtained, unless such person is actually present, in person or by telephone, at the meeting, and in the case of written consents, unless such person shall have actually returned such written consent within the time period specified in the transmittal thereof. In the event of their death, the Honorary Co-Chairperson position(s) may be left vacant. Vacancies may be filled by the Board as in the manner vacancies in the Board of Directors are filled.

Section 4. The Chairperson of the Board

The Chairperson of the Board shall: (a) preside over all meetings of the Board of Directors and meetings of the Executive Committee; (b) be an ex-officio member of all committees, unless otherwise provided by these bylaws, and shall have a vote on all matters coming before the committees of which he or she is a member; (c) appoint committee chairs and members, unless otherwise provided for in these bylaws; (d) help secure resources for the organization; and (e) in the absence of the President, or in the event of the President's death, inability or refusal to act, perform the duties of the President, and, when so acting, have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the President.

Section 5. The President

The President shall be the principal executive officer of the Corporation and, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, shall, in general, supervise and direct the business and affairs of the Corporation. The President shall, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of President and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors. The President (or his or her designee), in consultation with the Officers of the Corporation, shall have authority over and supervise the Corporation's fundraising and administrative staff. He or she may sign and execute all authorized bonds, mortgages, contracts, notes or other obligations in the name and on behalf of the Corporation, except in cases where the signing and execution thereof shall be expressly delegated by the Board of Directors or by these Bylaws to some other Officer or agent of the Corporation or shall be required by law to be otherwise signed or executed. The President may also from time to time delegate in writing his or her authority to sign or execute such documents to any other Officer of the Corporation as the President deems appropriate. Except as otherwise provided herein, the President shall serve as an ex-officio member of all committees, and shall have a vote on all matters coming before the committees of which he or she is an ex officio member (other than the Audit Committee.) The President shall, in general, perform all duties incident to the office of the President and shall perform such other duties as may be prescribed from time to time by the Board of Directors.

Section 6. The Vice Chairperson(s)

In the absence of the Chairperson of the Board, or in the event of the Chairperson of the Board's death, inability or refusal to act, the Vice Chairperson (or in the event there be more than one Vice Chairperson, the Vice Chairperson in the order designated at the time of their election, or in the absence of any designation, then in the order of their election) shall perform the duties of the Chairperson of the Board and, when so acting, shall have all the powers of and be subject to all the restrictions upon the Chairperson of the Board.

Section 7. The Secretary

The Secretary shall ensure that: (a) minutes of all the proceedings of the Board of Directors and the Executive Committee are kept and distributed in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws; (b) notices of the Board of Directors meetings are given in accordance with the provisions of the Bylaws or as otherwise required by law; and (c) the corporate records and the seal of the Corporation are secure and maintained and that the seal of the Corporation is affixed to any documents requiring the seal. Further, the Secretary shall execute and verify or cause to be executed and verified the annual report of the Corporation if required by law and in general perform all the duties incident to the office of Secretary, subject to the control of the Board of Directors, and shall do and perform such other duties as may be assigned to him or her from time to time by the Board of Directors, the Executive Committee, the Chairperson of the Board, or the President.

Section 8. The Treasurer

The Treasurer shall: (a) cause correct and complete books and records of accounts to be kept on file in the principal place of business of the Corporation; (b) have signature authority over and be responsible for all funds and securities of the Corporation from any source whatsoever; (c) oversee receipt of monies due and payable to the Corporation from any source whatsoever; (d) cause all corporate funds to be immediately deposited upon receipt in any bank or other depository as may be designated by the Board of Directors; (e) cause the funds of the Corporation to be disbursed as may be approved by the President, the Secretary or the Board of Directors; (f) Chair the Committee on Budget, Finance and Investment (g) render to the Chairperson of the Board, President or the Board of Directors, at any time requested, an account of all transactions of the Treasurer and of the financial condition of the Corporation; and (h) in general, perform the duties of the office of the Treasurer and such other duties as may be assigned by the Chairperson of the Board or by the Board of Directors; provided that the Treasurer may, with the approval of the Board of Directors or the Executive Committee, engage reputable financial or accounting organizations to perform certain of these duties and/or give counsel and delegate some or all of these duties to the President and staff.

Section 9. Compensation.

Officers shall not receive any stated salary for their services as Officers, but may request, and if requested shall be entitled to receive, reimbursement for actual and reasonable expenses incurred during the performance of his or her duties as Officers on behalf of the Corporation.

**ARTICLE IV
COMMITTEES**

Section 1. Committees

Standing committees of the Corporation shall be an Executive Committee, a Nominating Committee, a Resource Development Committee, a Committee on Budget, Finance, and Investment, a Committee on Research, Scholarship and Academic Relations, an Audit Committee, and such other committees as may be established from time to time by the Board of Directors. Unless otherwise determined by the Board of Directors, committee chairpersons must be Regularly Elected Directors and no Regularly Elected Director shall be the chairperson of more than one committee at the same time. Committee Chairpersons shall preside at the meetings of the respective committees, or, in his or her absence, a vice-chairperson appointed by such Committee Chairperson shall preside.

Section 2. Executive Committee

(a) The Board of Directors shall, at its Annual Meeting, elect from its number at least three persons to serve for one year, together with the Officers, as an executive

committee ("**Executive Committee**"), which shall advise and aid the Officers of the Corporation in any and all matters concerning its interests and shall possess and may exercise the powers and authority of the Board of Directors during the intervals between the meetings of the Board of Directors in such way as the Executive Committee deems in the best interests of the Corporation, in all cases in which specific directions or authority shall not have been given by the Board of Directors. The person holding the position of Ex Officio Director shall also be an ex-officio member of the Executive Committee, and shall have a vote on all matters coming before the Executive Committee.

(b) The Executive Committee shall meet at a time and place designated by the President at the call of the Chairperson of the Board, any Vice Chairperson, or upon the written request of three (3) members of the Committee to the Secretary. The purpose of each meeting of the Executive Committee shall be stated in the notice thereof.

(c) A majority of the Executive Committee shall constitute a quorum at any meeting and meetings shall be chaired by the Chairperson of the Board or in his or her absence, any Vice Chairperson, in order of designation, if designation was made, or if none, then in order of election. Vacancies in the Executive Committee shall be filled at the discretion of and by appointment by the Chairperson of the Board.

(d) The Committee may, from time to time, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, prescribe other rules and regulations for the conduct of meetings of the Committee and other matters relating to its procedure and the exercise of its powers.

(e) Minutes of all meetings of the Executive Committee shall be reported to the Board of Directors by the Secretary in writing within forty-five (45) days.

Section 3. Nominating Committee

(a) At each Annual Meeting or within sixty (60) days thereafter, the Chairperson of the Board, who will serve for the year following the date of the Annual Meeting in question, working in close consultation with the President, shall appoint a Nominating Committee Chairperson. The Chairperson of the Board, working in close consultation with the President and Nominating Committee Chairperson shall appoint two or more Directors who, with the Nominating Committee Chairperson, shall constitute a Nominating Committee, to serve until the Annual Meeting next following. In the appointment of this Committee, the Chairperson of the Board shall take appropriate account of the national character of the Corporation.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Nominating Committee to present to the Board of Directors the names of persons proposed for membership on the Board of Directors, for the several offices of the Corporation and membership on the Executive Committee. The Committee shall, prior to formulating its recommendations, canvass the membership of the Board for suggestions of persons to be nominated.

(c) The Nominating Committee shall transmit its recommended slate in writing to the Secretary in time sufficient to allow the nominations to reach the members of the Board of Directors not less than ten (10) days prior to the Annual Meeting, Special Meeting or Regular Meeting at which such nominations are to be acted upon. In the case of a mail ballot, as provided for in Section 13 of Article II and Section 2 of Article III, the Nominating Committee shall similarly give notice of the nomination(s) at least ten (10) days prior to the mailing of the ballot.

Section 4. Resource Development Committee

(a) At each Annual Meeting or within sixty (60) days thereafter, the Chairperson of the Board, who will serve for the year following the date of the Annual Meeting in question, working in close consultation with the President, shall appoint a Resource Development Committee Chairperson. The Chairperson of the Board, working in close consultation with the President and the Resource Development Committee Chairperson, shall appoint two or more Directors who, with the Resource Development Committee Chairperson, shall constitute a Resource Development Committee, to serve until the Annual Meeting next following.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Resource Development Committee to oversee and monitor the resource development (fundraising) activities of the Corporation and to assist in providing long-range planning for the Corporation regarding the maintenance and development of its financial resources.

Section 5. Committee on Budget, Finance and Investment

(a) At each Annual Meeting or within sixty (60) days thereafter, the Chairperson of the Board who will serve for the year following the date of the Annual Meeting in question, working in close consultation with the President and the Treasurer, shall appoint two or more Directors to serve with the Treasurer as chair and constitute a Committee on Budget, Finance and Investment to serve until the Annual Meeting next following.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Committee on Budget, Finance and Investment, with the assistance of the President and staff, to (a) prepare budget recommendations for the next fiscal period for consideration at the next Annual Meeting of the Board; (b) oversee and monitor the Corporation's annual budget as approved by the Board; (c) ensure that appropriate financial reports are made available to the Board on a timely basis; and (d) supervise the investment of the Corporation's funds.

Section 6. Committee on Research, Scholarship and Academic Relations

(a) At each Annual Meeting or within sixty (60) days thereafter, the Chairperson of the Board who will serve for the year following the date of the Annual Meeting in question, working in close consultation with the President, shall appoint a Research, Scholarship and Academic Relations Committee Chairperson. The Chairperson of the Board, working in close consultation with the President and the Research, Scholarship and

Academic Relations Committee Chairperson, shall appoint two or more Directors who, with the Research, Scholarship and Academic Relations Committee Chairperson, shall constitute a Committee on Research, Scholarship and Academic Relations to serve until the Annual Meeting next following.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Committee on Research, Scholarship and Academic Relations to (i) advise the Institute (and through it the Library) on the policies and procedures of programs supported by the Institute that affect scholarly research or interpretation, including relations with universities as co-sponsors of or participants in such programs; and (ii) review and recommend action on applications under grants and awards programs operated by the Institute.

Section 7. Audit Committee

(a) At each Annual Meeting or within sixty (60) days thereafter, the Chairperson of the Board who will serve for the year following the date of the Annual Meeting in question, working in close consultation with the President and the Treasurer, shall appoint the Audit Committee Chairperson. The Chairperson of the Board, working in close consultation with the President, the Treasurer and the Audit Committee Chairperson, shall appoint two or more Directors to constitute an audit committee ("**Audit Committee**") to serve until the Annual Meeting next following. The Audit Committee Chairperson and each member of the Committee must be independent; that is, must not be a member of management of the Corporation, must not have a financial interest in any entity doing business with the Corporation and must not be receiving any compensation, either directly or indirectly, from the Corporation as a consultant or for other professional services. At least one member of the Audit Committee must be a financial expert, as such term is established by the Board of Directors, or as otherwise required by applicable law or regulation. Members of management of the Corporation shall not serve as members of the Audit Committee, nor shall they be involved in the establishment of the Audit Committee. Non-executive members of staff may provide staff assistance to the Audit Committee, as required.

(b) It shall be the duty of the Audit Committee to (i) interview, investigate and make recommendations for the hiring of the outside audit firm to be engaged by the Corporation to perform the Corporation's annual audit of its financial statements (and negotiate its fees), and to establish the scope of the audit (and consider changing audit firms at least every five (5) years; (ii) require the audit firm to disclose to the Audit Committee all critical accounting policies and practices used within the Corporation as well as share with the Audit Committee any discussions the audit firm has had with management regarding those policies and practices; (iii) ensure that the audit firm does not provide any other services to the Corporation during the time it is providing audit services, with the exception of tax preparation services, which must be approved in advance by the Board of Directors; (iv) coordinate implementation of the Corporation's conflict of interest policy with the President; (v) meet with representatives of the audit firm at the conclusion of the audit, review with them the audit report and any management letter, and recommend approval or modification of the audit report to the Board of

Directors; (vi) set rules and processes for complaints concerning accounting and internal control practices; (vii) ensure the Corporation's audit and Form 990 or 990-PF are readily available, as required by law; and (viii) perform such other duties as may be required or recommended under applicable law or regulations.

Section 8. Other Committees

(a) The Board of Directors may appoint from its number and/or from among such other persons as the Board of Directors may see fit, at any time or from time to time, other Committees, and may from time to time add additional members thereto. The members of such Committees shall serve at the pleasure of the Board of Directors. Such Committees shall advise with and aid the Officers of the Corporation in all matters designated by the Board of Directors. Each such Committee may, from time to time, subject to the approval of the Board of Directors, prescribe rules and regulations for the calling and conduct of meetings of the Committee and other matters relating to its procedure.

Section 9. Provisions Applicable to Committee Meetings

(a) Notice of any meeting of any Committee shall be served personally or by mail, facsimile transmission, express delivery service or telegram not less than ten (10), nor more than sixty (60) days before the meeting. If notice of a meeting is given by mail or express delivery service, it shall be deemed to be delivered when deposited in the United States mail or with the express delivery service, with postage or delivery charges thereon prepaid, respectively, addressed to the Committee member at his or her residence or usual place of business. If notice is given by facsimile transmission or telegram, it shall be deemed to be delivered when a successful facsimile transmission to a facsimile machine of the Committee member is confirmed by the sender's facsimile machine or when it is delivered to the telegraph company, addressed to the Committee member at his or her residence or usual place of business, respectively.

(b) Members of the Committees may participate in any meeting by means of conference telephone or similar communications equipment whereby all persons participating in the meeting can simultaneously hear each other. Participation in a meeting in this manner shall constitute presence in person at the meeting.

(c) Committee members shall not receive any stated salary for their services, but may request, and if requested shall be entitled to receive, reimbursement for actual and reasonable expenses they incur to attend any meeting of a committee on which they serve.

(d) At any time and from time to time during a committee meeting, the presiding officer of the meeting, as provided in Section 1 of this Article, may declare the meeting to be in Executive Session, during which Executive Session all persons who are not Regularly Elected Directors may be excused from the meeting. The Committee is not permitted to adopt policy or resolutions or take other formal action during such Executive

Session. The minutes of the meeting will reflect that the meeting went into Executive Session, but will not report the discussions during the Executive Session.

(e) A quorum shall consist of not less than one-third of the then-existing regularly appointed and ex-officio Committee members at the relevant time. Honorary Trustees and National Advisory Council Members will not be counted for purposes of determining a quorum. In the absence of a quorum, or when a quorum is present, a meeting may be adjourned from time to time by a majority of the votes cast by the Committee members present in person without notice other than by announcement at the meeting and without further notice to any absent member. At any adjourned meeting at which a quorum shall be present, any business may be transacted which might have been transacted at the meeting as originally notified. At every meeting of the Committee, each Committee member present in person, including Honorary Trustees and National Advisory Council Members then present, shall be entitled to vote. Each such person shall be entitled to one vote. Upon the demand of any person entitled to vote, the vote upon any question before the meeting shall be by written ballot. All questions shall be decided by a majority of the votes cast by the those present in person entitled to vote. An abstention shall be counted as a vote not cast.

ARTICLE V HONORARY TRUSTEES

The Board of Directors shall establish a group of Honorary Trustees which shall be composed of such number, have such officers, have such functions or purposes and have such other features and duties as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. The Honorary Trustees shall provide such advice and assistance and engage in such projects and endeavors as may be requested from time to time by the Board of Directors. Honorary Trustees may vote at any meeting of any of the Corporation's standing or ad hoc committees (other than the Audit Committee), but shall have no right to vote at meetings of the Board or upon matters otherwise presented to the Board. Notwithstanding the grant of such voting rights, such persons are not deemed members of any Committee for any other purpose, including, without limitation, determining whether a quorum requirement has been met, or whether the requisite vote has been obtained, unless such person is actually present (in person or by telephone) at such meeting, and in the case of written consents, shall have actually returned such written consent within the time period specified in the transmittal thereof.

ARTICLE VI NATIONAL ADVISORY COUNCIL

The Board of Directors shall establish a National Advisory Council ("**Council**"), which shall be composed of a group of up to ten (10) members. The Council will have such functions or purposes and other such features and duties as the Board of Directors shall from time to time determine. Initially, Council members will advance the mission of the Library on a national level and will help identify and develop philanthropic

opportunities, explore the potential for greater federal and state appropriations, enhance public awareness, and advise the Board of Directors on national trends in the humanities, art, culture and education. The Council will be comprised of nationally prominent business, political, philanthropic and academic leaders. Council members shall be appointed by the Board to an initial term of three (3) years. Council members' terms may be renewed for subsequent terms at the discretion of the Board. Council members may vote at any meeting of any of the Corporation's standing or ad-hoc committees (other than the Audit Committee), but will have no right to vote at meetings of the Board or upon matters otherwise presented to the Board. Notwithstanding the grant of such voting rights, such persons are not deemed members of any Committee for any other purpose, including, without limitation, determining whether a quorum requirement has been met, or whether the requisite vote has been obtained, unless such person is actually present (in person or by telephone) at such meeting, and in the case of written consents, shall have actually returned such written consent within the time period specified in the transmittal thereof.

ARTICLE VII INDEMNIFICATION

Section 1. Contract

The provisions of this Article shall be in the nature of a contract between the Corporation and each of its Directors, Officers, Honorary Trustees and National Advisory Council Members (collectively, "**Indemnitees**") made in consideration of such persons' continued service to the Corporation. The protection afforded to each Indemnitee by the provisions of this Article shall survive such person's term of office or employment. This Article may not be repealed, nor may the benefits to the Indemnitee afforded hereby be diminished, except as to liability accruing in respect of acts or omissions occurring after the date of such repeal or modification.

Section 2. Indemnification

The Corporation shall hold harmless and indemnify each Indemnitee to the fullest extent authorized or permitted by the provisions of Subsections 1 through 6 and 9 through 11 of Section 355.476, Missouri Revised Statutes, as amended (which Section, in its entirety, is hereinafter referred to as the "State Statute") or any other or additional statutory provisions which are hereafter adopted authorizing or permitting such indemnification. The Corporation may purchase and maintain insurance relating to such matters as provided in subsection 8 of the State Statute.

Section 3. Insurance

The Corporation shall purchase and maintain for the benefit of each Indemnitee, as named insured or additional insured, a policy or policies of general comprehensive liability insurance (covering claims arising out of death, illness or injury or arising out of property loss or damage) and directors' and officers' liability insurance (covering claims arising out of wrongful acts or omissions) in respect of liabilities asserted against and/or incurred by

its Indemnitees in any such capacity or otherwise in the performance of their services for the Corporation.

Section 4. Expenses

In addition to the foregoing, and subject only to the exclusions set forth in Section 5 of this Article, the Corporation shall, to the fullest extent authorized or permitted by the provisions of Subsection 7 of the State Statute, hold harmless and indemnify each Indemnitee: (a) against any and all expenses (including attorneys' fees), judgments, fines and amounts paid in settlement actually and reasonably incurred by such Indemnitee in connection with any threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal, administrative or investigative (including an action by or in the right of the Corporation) to which such Indemnitee is, was or at any time became a party, or is threatened to be made a party, by reason of the fact that such Indemnitee is, was or at any time becomes a Director, Honorary Trustee, Officer, National Advisory Council member, employee or agent of the Corporation, or is or was serving or at any time serves at the request of the Corporation as a director, trustee, officer, employee or agent of another Corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise; and (b) otherwise to the fullest extent as may be provided to such Indemnitee by the Corporation under the non exclusivity provisions of the State Statute.

Section 5. Limitations

No indemnity pursuant to Section 4 of this Article shall be paid by the Corporation: (a) except to the extent the aggregate of losses to be indemnified thereunder exceeds the amount of such losses for which the Indemnitee is indemnified either pursuant to Section 2 of this Article or pursuant to any insurance of the type referred to in Section 3 of this Article purchased and maintained by the Corporation; (b) in respect of remuneration paid to such Indemnitee if it shall be determined by a final decision of a court having jurisdiction in the matter that such remuneration was in violation of law; (c) on account of such Indemnitee's conduct which is finally adjudged by a court having jurisdiction in the matter to have been knowingly fraudulent, deliberately dishonest or willful misconduct; or (d) if a final decision by a court having jurisdiction in the matter shall determine that such indemnification is not lawful.

Section 6. Term of Obligations

All agreements and obligations of the Corporation contained in this Article shall continue during the period the Indemnitee is a Director, Honorary Trustee, Officer or National Advisory Council Member of the Corporation (or is or was serving at the request of the Corporation as a director, trustee, officer, employee or agent of another corporation, partnership, joint venture, trust or other enterprise) and shall continue thereafter so long as the Indemnitee shall be subject to any possible claim or threatened, pending or completed action, suit or proceeding, whether civil, criminal or investigative, by reason of the fact that he or she was a Director, Honorary Trustee, Officer or National Advisory Council Member of the Corporation or was serving in any other capacity referred to in this Article.

The Corporation will pay, in advance of the final disposition of the action, suit or proceeding, all reasonable expenses of the Indemnitee incurred in defending any civil or criminal action, suit or proceeding against him or her, provided he or she shall have agreed to reimburse the Corporation if and to the extent that it shall be ultimately determined that he or she is not entitled to be indemnified by the Corporation for such expenses.

ARTICLE VIII CONTRACTS

Section 1. Authority to Bind Corporation

The Board of Directors, except as otherwise provided in these Bylaws, may authorize any Officer or Officers, agent or agents, to enter into any contract or execute and deliver any instrument in the name of and on behalf of the Corporation, and such authority may be general or confined to specific instances; and unless so authorized by the Board of Directors, no Officer, agent or employee, other than the President and his or her authorized delegate as described in Section 5 of Article III, shall have any power or authority to bind the Corporation by any contract or engagement or to pledge its credit or render it liable pecuniarily for any purpose or to any amount.

Section 2. Budget Authority

The approval by the Board of Directors of the Corporation's annual budget or of a specific program calling for the commitment and/or expenditure of funds of the Corporation shall be considered to confer upon the Officers of the Corporation the authority referred to in the first paragraph of this Article.

Section 3. Trade Names and Trademarks

The trade names, service marks, and trademarks of the Corporation include but are not limited to THE HARRY S. TRUMAN LIBRARY INSTITUTE FOR NATIONAL AND INTERNATIONAL AFFAIRS, TRUMAN LIBRARY INSTITUTE, WHITEHOUSE DECISION CENTER, and WHDC (referred to collectively hereinafter, together with any other names and marks that the Corporation may adopt or put into use, as the "Marks"). The Institute owns the Marks and has the exclusive right to use them and to grant rights to others to use them. The Marks have valuable goodwill, including without limitation the Corporation's reputation, associated with them. Any other provision of this Article or these Bylaws to the contrary notwithstanding, the Institute shall not enter into any agreement, oral or written, granting or giving permission for use by any other person or entity of any of the Marks or the reputation or goodwill of the Institute, nor shall permission for such use otherwise be given, formally or informally, for any reason whatsoever, without the prior approval of the Board of Directors, regardless of whether such grant, permission, or right to use is or has been given by an Officer, Director, the Coordinator of Programs, a Corporation employee, or any other representative of the Corporation. Any grant, permission, or right to use not

given in accordance with this Section shall be null, void, without the authority of the Corporation, and unenforceable against it.

**ARTICLE IX
AGENTS AND REPRESENTATIVES**

The Board of Directors may appoint such agents and representatives of the Corporation with such powers and to perform such acts or duties on behalf of the Corporation, and for such compensation as the Board of Directors may see fit, insofar as may be consistent with these Bylaws, to the extent authorized or permitted by law.

**ARTICLE X
VOTING UPON STOCK OF OTHER CORPORATIONS**

Unless otherwise ordered by the Board of Directors, the President shall have full power and authority on behalf of the Corporation to vote, either in person or by proxy, at meetings of stockholders of any corporation in which this Corporation may hold stock, and at any such meetings may possess and exercise any and all of the rights and powers incident to the ownership of such stock which, as the owner thereof, this Corporation might have possessed and exercised if present. The Board of Directors may confer like powers upon other person or persons from time to time, and may revoke any such powers as granted at its pleasure.

**ARTICLE XI
AMENDMENTS**

The Bylaws may be altered, amended, or repealed at any meeting of the Board of Directors by a majority of all votes cast by Directors present, provided that the text of the proposed amendment(s) shall have been transmitted in writing to the members of the Board of Directors at least ten (10) days prior to such meeting. An abstention shall count as a vote not cast.
