Casa Pacific provides specialty mental health services through both residential and community based programs. Services including case management, individual therapy, crisis intervention and rehabilitative activities are provided daily to an average 75 campus residents. Community programs in both Ventura County and Santa Barbara County work with an average 270 youth and their families each month providing approximately 5 hours per family a week with intensive behavioral services intended to help families weather a crisis and to keep the youth in their homes and schools.

4b (Code:) (Expenses \$ 2,704,629. including grants of \$) (Revenue \$)

The Residential Treatment Center works with children who have been diagnosed as Severely Emotionally Disturbed (SED) and houses up to 28 children and youth between the ages of 10 and 18. The residents attend our non-public school on campus until they are able to transition to a public school. The average length of stay is 290 days.

4c (Code:) (Expenses \$ 2,533,168. including grants of \$) (Revenue \$)

The Crisis Care Shelter provides short-term care for children and youth under age 18 who have been removed from their homes by the court system because of abuse or neglect. Up to 45 residents are provided with their daily needs, mental health support and transportation to schools until a foster or family placement can be arranged. The average length of stay is 51 days.
