1. Accounting Policies

Organization

Utah Avalanche Center is a non-profit corporation under section 501(c)3 of the Internal Revenue Service. The entity was organized and operates under the laws of the State of Utah. The mission is to keep people on top of the Greatest Snow on Earth. The UAC provides avalanche forecasting, education and awareness programs like Know Before You Go (KBYG) to provide backcountry travelers the tools they need to stay alive and have fun in avalanche terrain.

Accounting Method

The organization prepares its statements on the accural basis of accounting, whereby income and expenses are recognized when earned and incurred.

Estimates

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles. This requires management to make estiamtes and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates and those differences could be material.

Cash and Cash Equivalents

The organization considers all cash and highly liquid financial instruments with orginial maturities of three months or less, and which are neither held for nor restricted by donors for long-term purposes, to be cash and cash equivalents. Cash and highly liquid financial instruments restricted to capital expenditures, permananet endowment, or other long-term purposes of Friends of the Utah Avalanche Forecast Center are excluded from this definition.

Net Assets

Unrestricted Net Assets- Net Assets available for use in general operations.

Temporarily Restricted Net Assets- Net assets subject to donor restrictions that may or will be met by expenditures or actions of Friends of the Utah Avalanche Center and/or the passage of time.

Permanently Restricted Net Assets- Net assets who use is limited by donor-imposed restrictions that neither expire by the passage of time nor can be fulfilled or otherwise removed by action of Utah Avalanche Center.

Inventory

Inventories are stated at lower of cost or market, determined by the first-in first-out method.

3. Federal Income Taxes

The organization is organized as a Utah nonprofit corporation and has been recognized by the Internal Revenue Service (IRS) as
exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(a) of the Internal Revenue Code as an organization described in Section
501(c)(3), qualifying for the charitable contribution deduction under Section 170(b)(1)(A)(vi), and has been determined to not be a
private foundation. The organization is annually required to file a Return of Organziation Exempt from Income Tax (Form 990) with the
IRS. In addition, Utah Avalanche Center is subject to income tax on net income that is derived from business activities that are
unrelated to its exempt purpose. The organization has determined it is not subject to unrelated business income tax and has not filed
an 990-T with the IRS.
