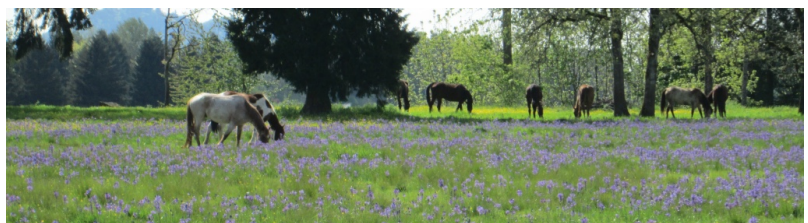


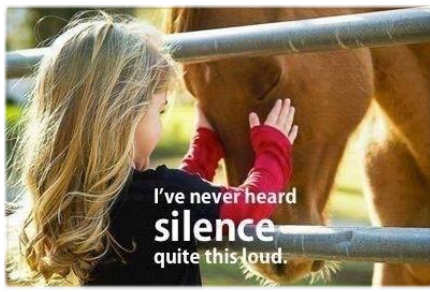
Hay Barn
