SETTING: SALVATION ARMY

SUSIE, an 18-year-old girl who dreams of becoming a filmmaker one day, contacts Saving Grace while living at the Salvation Army with her father. After bouncing from shelter to shelter and spending the nights in between at the Days Inn Hotel, she longs for stability and support to reach her goals.

Echoing in her heart are the words her grade school teacher once told her, "You're retarded and will never amount to much." Determined to overcome the expectations placed upon her, she enrolls in Northwest Arkansas Community College (NWACC) through her disability support but has no housing.

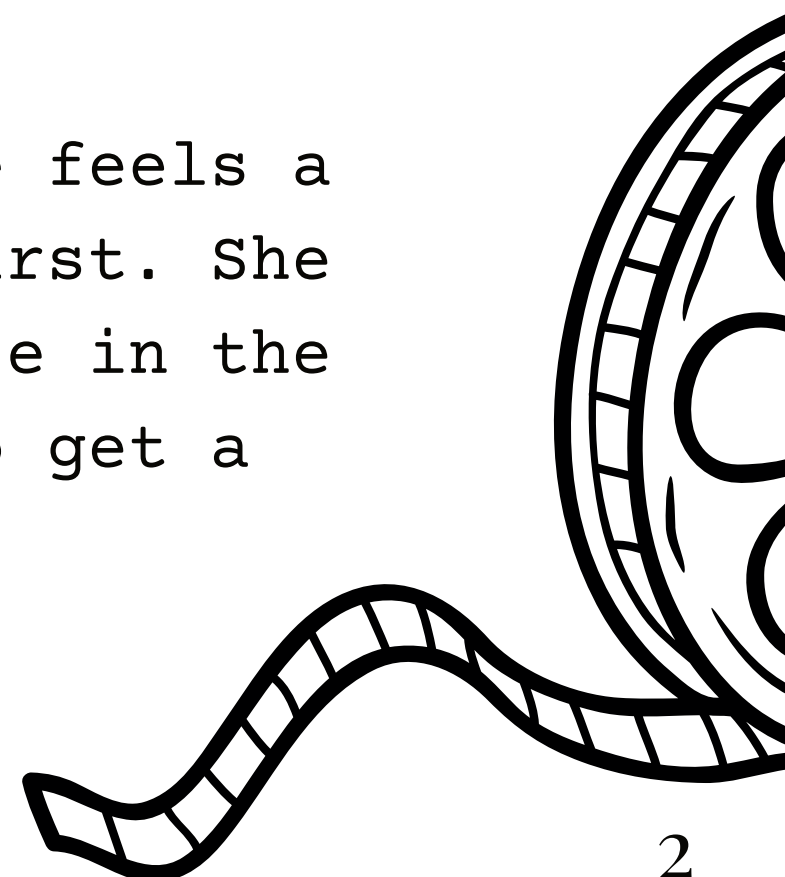
Without stable housing, she knows it will not be long before she is forced to quit her studies simply to focus on surviving. Feeling scared but hopeful about her future, she picks up the phone and calls Saving Grace—an organization recommended to her by a counselor at NWACC.

SETTING: SAVING GRACE HOUSE ON POPLAR ST.

After interviewing to live at Saving Grace, SUSIE is invited to move in and begin the program. Eager to start, SUSIE arrives at Saving Grace at the little house on Poplar Street in Rogers with a bag of clothing.



SUSIE expresses that she feels a little intimidated at first. She does not know anyone else in the house yet but is glad to get a fresh start.

While at Saving Grace, SUSIE meets BRI, her program coach. BRI inspires and advocates for Susie in a way she has never experienced. BRI is also involved in cinematography and encourages SUSIE to keep moving forward, telling her that every step brings her closer to her goals. BRI helps Susie get the supplies she needs for her classes and works with the Program Team to introduce her to film experts in the community.



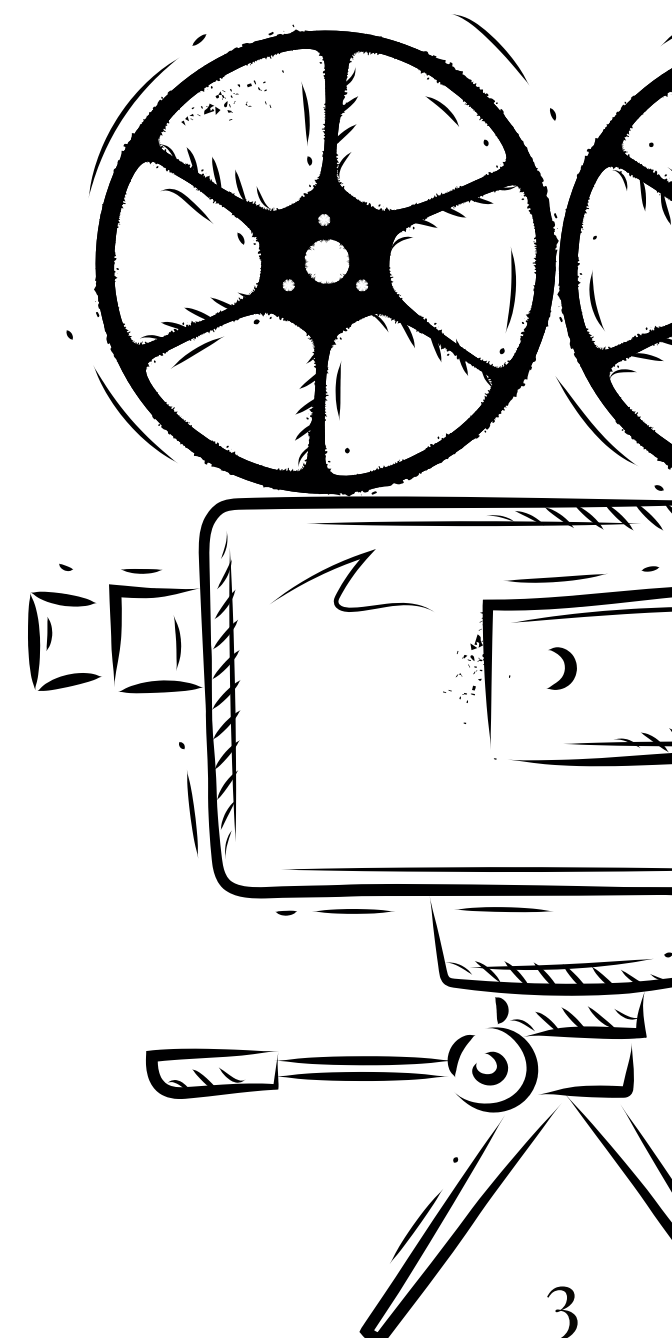
SUSIE has the chance to job shadow producer and director ANDREA CADELLI in her role as host and producer of a local TV news show.

ANDREA is the CEO and founder of Newcastle Media and Executive Producer at Fabled Motion Pictures and becomes a professional mentor to Susie.

SUSIE also starts therapy and says,

"Therapy has helped me learn how to better deal with my emotions. I'm learning how to process things."

She recognizes that she's no longer hesitant to try new things, so when the opportunity to transfer to The University of Central Arkansas and enroll in their film program opens up, SUSIE jumps on this opportunity!

Susie Goes to College

SETTING: THE UNIVERSITY OF CENTRAL ARKANSAS

SUSIE begins school at The University of Central Arkansas while remaining in contact with Saving Grace and her mentors, continuing to attend Grace Camp each fall.

In May 2023, she graduates with her Bachelor of Science in film. Still needing more support and training in life skills, she reapplies to the Saving Grace program to finish the program and obtain her driver's license before moving out on her own.

SETTING: Saving Grace at Grace Farms

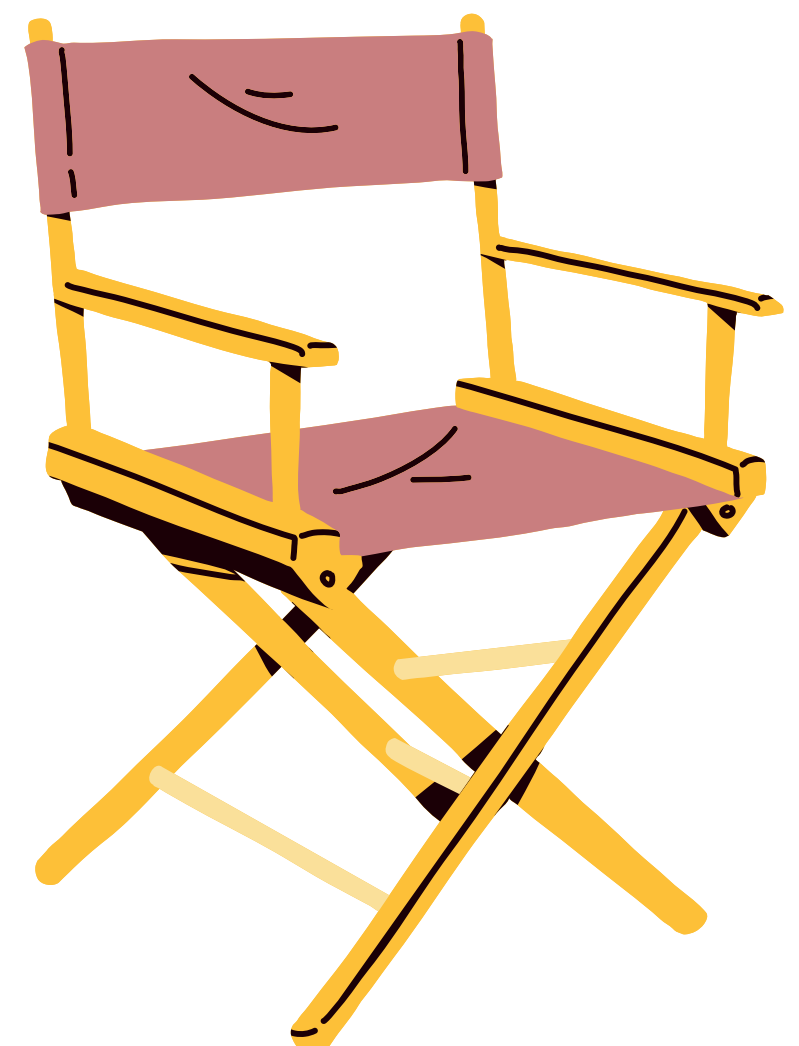
SUSIE is welcomed back home and moves with the current program to Grace Farms. She enrolls in Drivers Academy and prepares to take her driver's test.

She also works on finding a job so she can begin saving to purchase a car.

Susie continues to go deeper in her healing process and journey to independence by participating in counseling, coaching, and life skills courses as she makes plans and creates a path to get there—while having the safety to fail and try again within the care and support of Saving Grace.

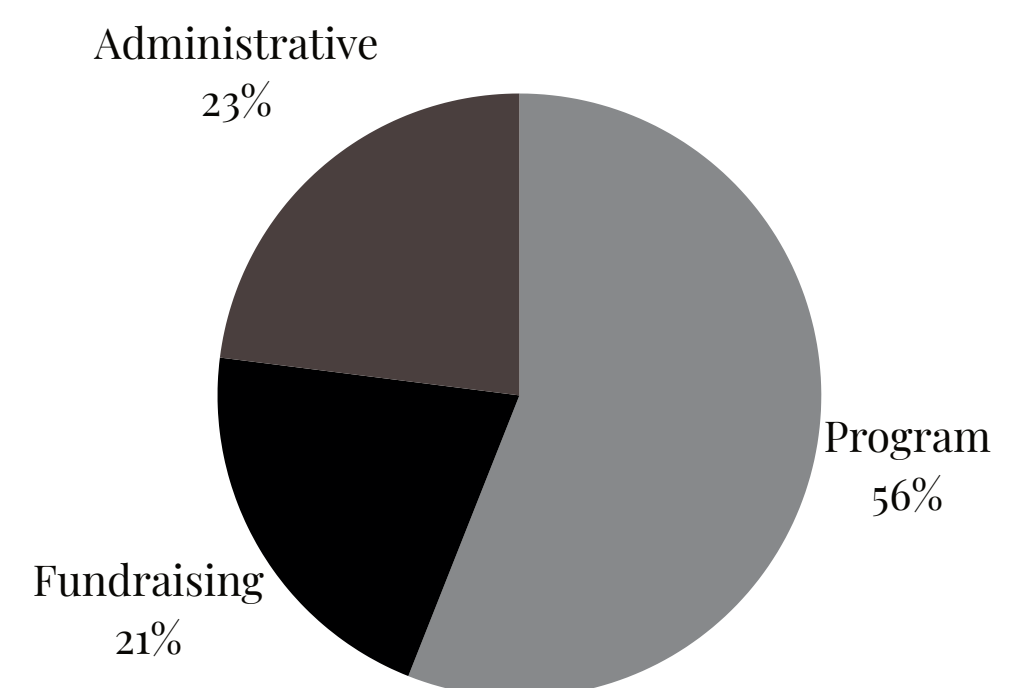

The fiscal year 2022-2023 was challenging yet exciting for Saving Grace as we moved to Grace Farms, where we are growing to serve 50 young women at a time. We celebrated our largest Butterflies and Blooms event this past year and hosted our first Uptown Hoedown fundraising event. These events combined increased our donor base and contributions. As shown, contributions increased 24% over the previous year, partly due to our move to the farm. We also had increased expenditures compared to '21-'22 as we welcomed "Grace" home. Our operating budget has doubled with our transition, and we have continued to watch God provide through YOU. Saving Grace is in a strong position to begin Phase II Growth in 2024.
