NOTES TO FINANCIAL STATEMENTS

JUNE 30, 2010

NOTE 1 – ORGANIZATION AND SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Organization - Lifelong Learning Institute in Chesterfield County, VA, Inc. (the "Institute") was organized as a non-profit corporation under the laws of Virginia for the purpose of providing a curriculum of intellectually stimulating learning opportunities and special activities for persons fifty (50) years of age or older.

<u>Basis of presentation</u> - The accounts of the Institute are maintained, and the financial statements are prepared, on the accrual basis of accounting. Accordingly, revenues are recognized when earned, and expenses are recognized when incurred. The financial statement presentation follows the recommendations of FASB ASC 958. Under FASB ASC 958, the Institute is required to report information regarding its financial position and activities according to three classes of net assets: unrestricted, temporarily restricted and permanently restricted. The Institute has no temporarily or permanently restricted net assets at June 30, 2010.

<u>Cash and cash equivalents</u> - Cash equivalents consist of highly liquid investments with an initial maturity of three months or less.

<u>Property and equipment</u>- Property and equipment are recorded at cost and are depreciated using the straight-line method over the estimated useful lives (ranging from five to seven years).

<u>Revenue recognition</u> - Amounts received are recorded as increases in unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions.

All donor-restricted contributions are reported as increases in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted net assets and reported in the statement of activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Membership fees cover classes for twelve months from date of receipt. Deferred membership fees represent unearned income as of year end.

<u>Estimates</u> - The preparation of financial statements in conformity with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect certain reported amounts and disclosures. Accordingly, actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 – INCOME TAXES

The Institute is a qualified non-profit charitable organization as defined by the Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3) and is thus exempt from federal income taxes. In addition, the Institute qualifies for charitable contributions deductions under Section 170(b)(1)(A) and has been classified as an organization that is not a private foundation under Section 509(a)(1). Income which is not related to exempt purposes, less applicable deductions, is subject to federal and state corporate income taxes. The Institute did not have any net unrelated business income for the year ended June 30, 2010.

The Institute, effective July 1, 2009, adopted FASB ASC 740-10 related to accounting for uncertainty in income taxes, which clarifies the accounting for income taxes by prescribing the minimum recognition threshold that a tax position is required to meet before being recognized in the financial statements. The standard also provides guidance on penalties and interest, classification, and disclosure. The Institute has not identified any uncertain tax positions. The Institute income tax returns for years since 2007 remain open for examination by tax authorities.

NOTE 3 – CONTRIBUTED SERVICES AND MATERIALS

The Institute provides a variety of classes to its members. All instructors, who are experts in their field, contribute their time to teach the classes. During the year ended June 30, 2010, the value of the instructors' hours contributed is \$40,988 and is recorded as unrestricted support and expenses.

Chesterfield County Public Schools provide the classroom space for the Institute to hold its classes. The value of contributed facilities is \$186,086 and is recorded as unrestricted support and expenses.

Donated computers are included in unrestricted support at their fair market value (\$7,800) when received.

NOTE 4 - CONTRACT LABOR

Effective October 30, 2006, the Institute's Executive Director became a part of the Virginia Center on Aging, Virginia Commonwealth University's payroll and benefits program. The Virginia Center bills the Institute quarterly for the costs associated with its Executive Director's services.

NOTE 5 - SUBSEQUENT EVENTS

In the preparation of its financial statements, Lifelong Learning Institute considered subsequent events through November 3, 2010, which was the date the financial statements were available to be issued.
