Report on the Financial Statements

We have audited the accompanying financial statements of Jessica June Children's Cancer Foundation, Inc. (a nonprofit organization) which comprise the statement of financial position as of December 31, 2018, and the related statements of activities and cash flows for the year then ended, and the related notes to the financial statements.

Management's Responsibility for the Financial Statements

Management is responsible for the preparation and fair presentation of these financial statements in accordance with accounting principles generally accepted in the United States of America; this includes the design, implementation, and maintenance of internal control relevant to the preparation and fair presentation of financial statements that are free from material misstatement, whether due to fraud or error.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES

Business Activity:

Jessica June Children's Cancer Foundation, Inc. (the "Organization"), was organized as a non-profit organization and is exempt from federal income taxes under Internal Revenue Code Section 501(c)(3). The Organization was formed in 2004 for the purpose to provide emergency financial assistance, hope, compassion and love to children and family members fighting childhood cancer.

Basis of Presentation:

Financial Statement presentation follows the recommendations of the Financial Accounting Standards Board in its Accounting Standards Codification ("ASC") which establishes FASB ASC as the source of authoritative U.S. accounting and reporting standards for nongovernmental entities. The Organization's resources are classified and reported in the accompanying financial statements as separate classes of net assets based on the existence or absence of donor-imposed restrictions as follows:

Restricted and Unrestricted Revenue Support:

Contributions received are recorded as unrestricted, temporarily restricted, or permanently restricted support, depending on the existence and/or nature of any donor restrictions. In addition, the Organization recognizes only those contributed services, which are provided by individuals possessing "specialized skills".

Support that is restricted by the donor is reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets if the restriction expires in the reporting period in which the support is recognized. All other donor-restricted support is reported as an increase in temporarily or permanently restricted net assets, depending on the nature of the restriction. When a restriction expires (that is, when a stipulated time restriction ends or purpose restriction is accomplished), temporarily restricted net assets are reclassified to unrestricted assets and reported in the Statement of Activities as net assets released from restrictions.

Cash and Cash Equivalents:

Cash and cash equivalents include bank accounts as well as certificates of deposit purchased with a maturity of three months or less. Interest income on the certificates of deposit is recorded as income when earned. At December 31, 2018, cash and cash equivalents included \$209,016 held in commercial banks.

Concentration of Credit Risk:

The Organization occasionally maintains deposits in excess of federally insured limits. Statement of Financial Accounting Standards No. 105 identifies these items as a concentration of credit risk requiring disclosure, regardless of the degree of risk. The risk is managed by maintaining all deposits in high quality financial institutions. At December 31, 2018 all accounts were below the federally insured limits.

Income Taxes - Uncertain Tax Positions:

The Organization is exempt from federal income taxes under Section 501(c)(3) of the Internal Revenue Code, except on net income derived from unrelated business activities. The Organization believes that it has appropriate support for any tax positions taken, and as such, does not have any uncertain tax positions that are material to the financial statements.

The Organization's federal Exempt Organization Business Income Tax Returns (Form 990) are subject to examination by the IRS, generally for three years after they were filed.

NOTE 1 - SUMMARY OF SIGNIFICANT ACCOUNTING POLICIES (continued)

Use of Estimates:

The preparation of financial statements in conformity with generally accepted accounting principles requires management to make estimates and assumptions that affect the reported amounts of assets and liabilities and disclosure of contingent assets and liabilities at the date of the financial statements and the reported amounts of revenues and expenses during the reporting period. Actual results could differ from those estimates.

NOTE 2 - SOURCE OF REVENUE

Grants:

The Organization records funding from grants in the period that the grant was awarded. Classification of the grants as unrestricted or temporarily restricted is based upon any grantor stipulations that limit the use of the grants. Grants that are temporarily restricted by the donor are reported as an increase in unrestricted net assets if the restriction expires in the reporting period in which the support is recognized.

NOTE 3 - INVESTMENTS

The investments consist of cash and certificates of deposit, with maturity date of over 3 months, and are presented in the financial statements at fair value based on quoted prices in active markets (all Level 1 measurements). Market risk could occur and is dependent on the future changes in market prices of the various investments held. An analysis of the investments held as of December 31, 2018 is as follows:
