Our Philosophy



PIH's Homeless Self-Sufficiency Program provides a year housing & services to help families become self-sufficient



PIH has 65 units of transitional housing for Homeless families

PIH Provides . . .



A year of Housing to stabilize the family's situation. Housing is matched to family size and transportation needs

Case management to help people chart and achieve their goals



Life skills classes to teach employment, money management, and personal skills

Budget and credit counseling, to help people gain financial knowledge and skills



PIH Scope . . .

Our last full operating year, PIH served **367 people** in 139 households, including 146 adults and 221 children

PIH Serves . . .

66% single mothers

Victims of Domestic Abuse **68%**

6% military veterans

People with disabilities **10%**

PIH Outcomes . . .

In FY12/13, PIH has had 69 Partners graduate the program (participating at least 90 days). Of these . . .

78% moved to stable,



long-term housing



71% increased their income

59% improved their employment

55% improved their education



77% improved their overall self-sufficiency!
