OUR IMPACT

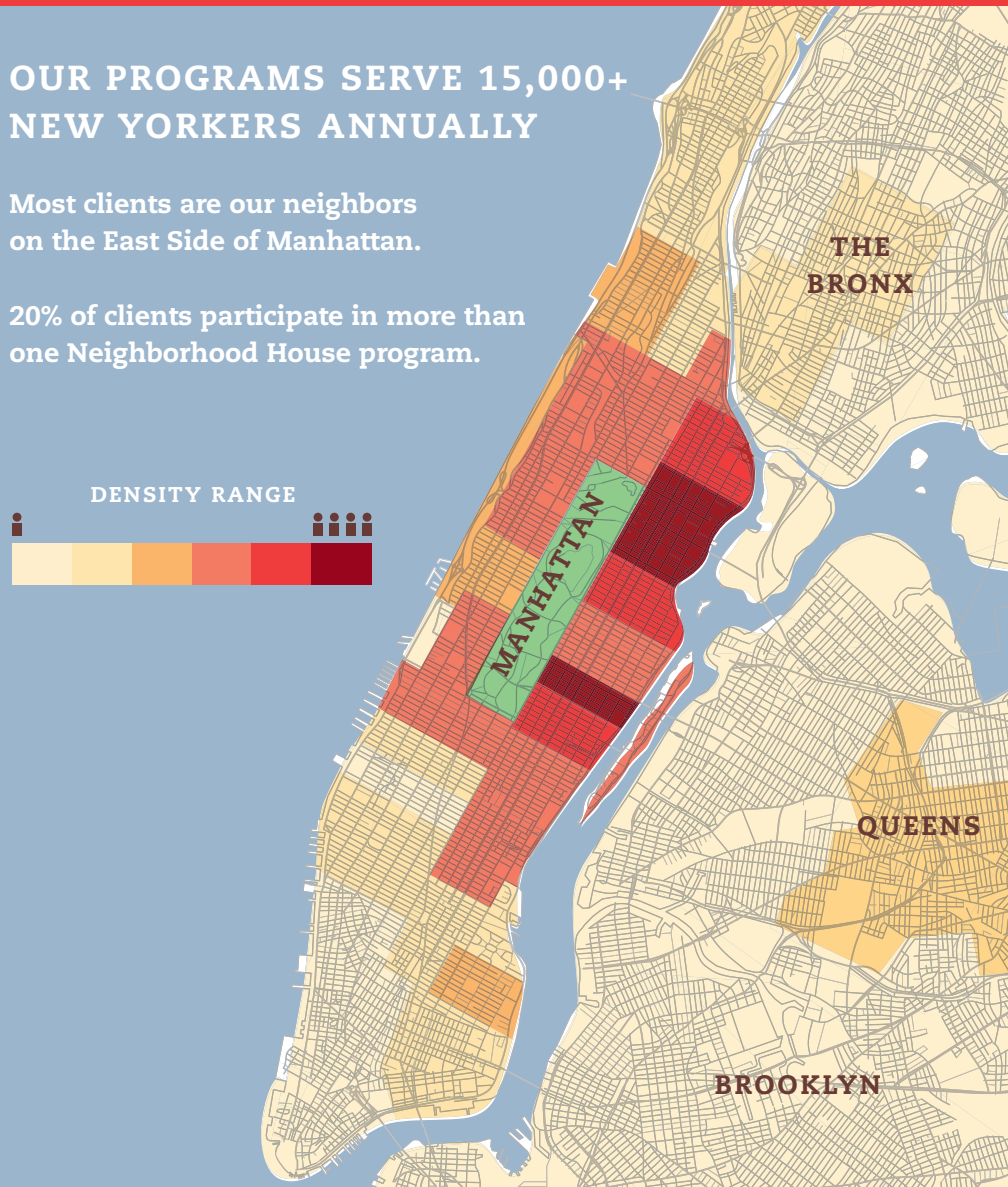

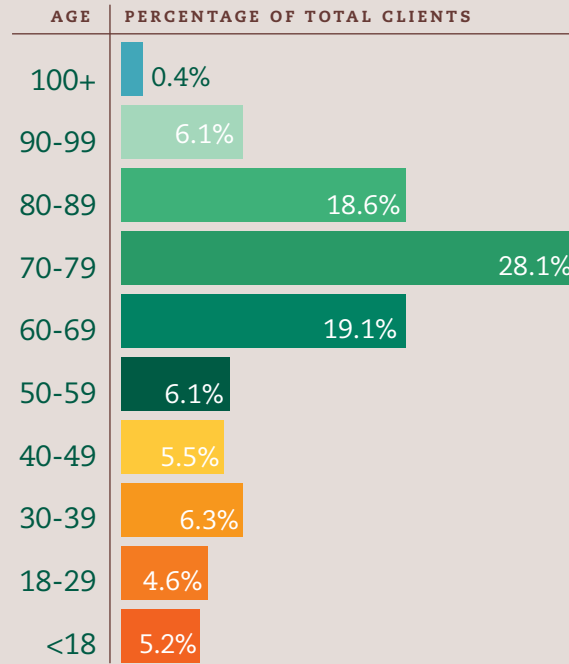
OUR PROGRAMS SERVE 15,000+ NEW YORKERS ANNUALLY

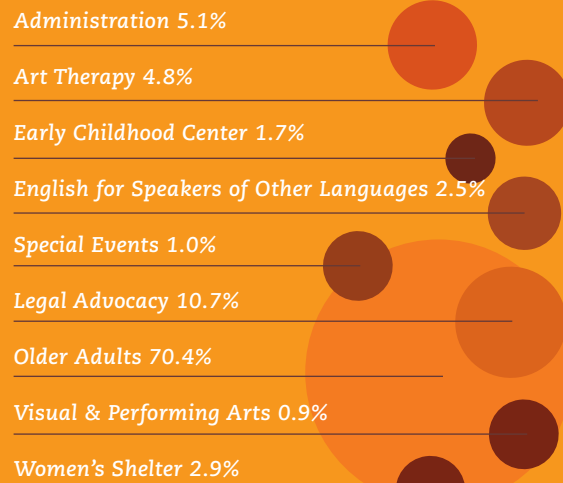
