WILDWOOD OUTDOOR EDUCATION CENTER

Our Vision: To offer all children the chance to experience the wonders of living and learning in the outdoors.

Our Mission: To immerse children in a unique outdoor environment that encourages social interaction and stimulates learning, especially urban children from the Kansas City region who might not otherwise have a positive relationship with nature in their daily lives

Our Values: Respect for Self, Respect for Others, Respect for the Environment

History

In 1962 Kansas City philanthropist Marjorie Powell Allen and her husband, Bob Allen, purchased 150 acres near La Cygne, Kansas to provide outdoor programs for children. In 1980, this facility that had been known as Allendale by Jingo was donated to establish Wildwood Outdoor Education Center.

Need & Area Served

Wildwood provides outdoor education, team building, and individual skill development to children and adults from the Kansas City metropolitan area. Wildwood is unique, in almost every aspect of being an outdoor education center and a residential camp setting. Wildwood meets or exceeds best practice models in outdoor education, adventure education and residential camps. There are no other outdoor education centers in the Midwest that provide an outdoor education/academic emphasis during the summer, residentially. While there are other ropes courses, there aren't any that are combined with outdoor education in a residential setting with urban youth as their target population. Wildwood offers the opportunity to build esteem, develop essential life and interpersonal skills and maintain/increase academic knowledge in a safe environment.

Current Programs

More than 6,500 youth and 500 adults have a *Wildwood Experience* each year. Wildwood Outdoor Education Center programs include:

- Summer Learning – outdoor education targeting urban youth from 4th-6th grade
- Summer Adventure – traditional residential camp experience for youth age 8-14
- Outdoor School – outdoor education programming offered jointly with public and private school staff from the KC Metro Area
- Adventure Challenge Course – low ropes course experience offering groups of youth mental and physical challenges that focus on team building, problem solving, cooperation, and developing trust
- Corporate Challenge – low and high ropes course experience offering adult groups mental and physical challenges that focus on team building, problem solving, planning, prioritizing, decision making, cooperation, leadership development and trust
- WOW (Women of Wildwood) – residential camp experience offering girls age 10-15 an opportunity for esteem building, skill development and leadership training

Outcomes

A *Wildwood Experience* will provide each participant an opportunity for learning and success. This outcome is achieved through structured outdoor education, adventure education and experiential education activities which:

- Enable participants to participate in group decision-making and hands-on problems solving
- Provides models for conflict resolution, problem solving and responsibility training
- Builds esteem and develops leadership skills through individual and small group activities that are success-oriented
- Introduce concepts that explore and value natural and cultural diversity

This belief was affirmed when they left Wildwood to get their Masters Degrees, start their own family, and seek professional opportunities with youth in the field of Social Welfare. During the twelve years they were gone, they had wonderful professional experiences that were growth promoting and professionally fulfilling, but were thrilled to return to Wildwood in 2001 as the Co-Executive Directors, and are happy to call Wildwood home once again.

Assistant Directors

Assistant Director **Grayson Magner** joined the Wildwood Staff as a cabin counselor in 2001. Since then he has worked as Wildwood in several capacities during every summer, except 2006. He graduated from Kansas State University in December of 2006, and joined the Wildwood Staff in a full time capacity January 3, 2007.

Assistant Director **Michael Harter** joined the Wildwood Staff as an Outdoor School Instructor & Adventure Challenge Course Facilitator in 2006. Since then he has worked at Wildwood in several capacities during the spring and fall seasons, and accepted the second Assistant Director position in August of 2007.

Michael is from Belton, Missouri and is an education major at University of Central Missouri. His extensive work with diverse populations in the field of youth development as an Intern for the American Youth Foundation International Leadership Conference and in adventure, outdoor and experiential education as an instructor and coordinator at Camp Miniwanca and Miniwanca Education Center in Michigan are a wonderful compliment to the skill sets Grayson brings to Wildwood Programming. While both Grayson and Michael have many strengths, talents and interests that benefit all of Wildwood's Programs, their genuine interest in both youth development and the natural world are what we are most excited about as they make Wildwood their permanent residence.
